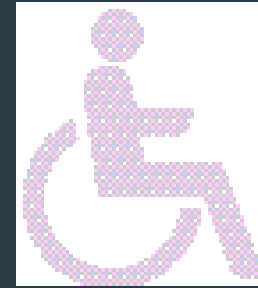

The Disability Rights Project is the result of a partnership between the Disability Rights Commission and the Law Centres Federation, providing 14 Disability Rights Workers in local Law Centres across England.

Most of the provisions of the Disability Discrimination Act 1995 (as amended) relating to discrimination in employment, education and access to goods, facilities and services are now in force, but many disabled people may still not be aware of their rights or how they can enforce them.



The Disability Rights Project aims particularly, to raise awareness about the goods and services provisions contained in Part 3 of the Disability Discrimination Act and to provide an advice and casework service for disabled people.

If you are a disabled person or you have a long term health condition that affects the way you live your daily life, it is important that you are aware of your rights and the advice and support that is available to you.

The Disability Rights Project is providing a Worker in your area who can:

- **Tell you** about your rights under the Disability Discrimination Act 1995.
- **Talk to** your group, agency or organisation about the provisions of the Act.
- **Advise you** if you feel you have been treated unfairly or been unable to access a service due to your disability.
- **Offer you** a casework service to enable you to take legal action to enforce your rights, where issues remain unresolved.
